In grade six, French, the Saint-Paul's program and the Sherwood's one merged to become one. Furthermore, Mme David is teaching sciences to all grade six students while Mme Dugas is teaching Social studies to all of them as well hence providing a good practice and preparation for high school.

In grade five French, Mr Teasdale and Mme Bélanger just completed a unit on flying objects and inventions and are getting ready to start a unit on Fairy tales. The grade five trip to Ottawa is coming shortly.
