- Ethics: Steve Balleine [Assistant Director General Administration] spoke on the ethics inquiry & the UPAC investigation into our [LBPSB] international program (mistakes were made & we are happy to work with the auditor assigned in order to move on to dispense the dark cloud, UPAC was contacted by the Board); Frank Clarke [Parent Commissioner] spoke on behalf of the Commissioners, saying they were limited in what they could share by the confidentiality agreements Commissioners were required to sign, & also that the ethics policy was meant to be rehabilitative on the first offense, not punitive (there will be further sanctions if the behavior continues); Nan Beaton offered that the Council members have consequently decided to review & revise the ethics policy; parents offered various views (let's move on & focus on what is within our purview, Ms. Stein Day needs to resign or be removed) but the prevailing opinion was that we need to move on; a draft letter to Council was discussed, revised & passed
