APPENDIX 2 Home & School

Recap of Home & School initiatives From Last Month:

- Holiday Fair: H&S hosted our annual holiday fair on December 2 at the SR school. The event included activities for the entire family. There were games, a raffle, silent auction, arts & crafts, cookie decorating & a bake sale. A portion of the profits from this event went towards the holiday food baskets & the JR school Lego wall initiative. The event was well attended & H&S made a profit of \$2,251
- Holiday Bazaar: The holiday bazaar was held at the SR school on December 15th. The children got the chance to buy \$2 gifts for mom, dad, siblings & pets; they headed home with their gifts pre-wrapped & ready to be put under the tree. H&S rented a bus to shuttle the JR children over throughout the day for their chance to shop. We came out ahead approximately \$600, as we had a lot of pet items (200+) donated by Ralph C. Hagen
- Holiday Baskets: Holiday baskets were delivered on December 20th to 12 families of 54 people. We collected \$1,647 in parent donations & H&S donated an additional \$800 which allowed us to spend \$2,447 for these families. The holiday baskets included: non-perishables, non-refrigerated perishables (fresh fruit & veg), a 25\$ grocery gift card for a turkey or other food choice, 25\$ grocery gift card per family member for perishable goods & 2 toys per child

- Movie night for both JR & SR school will be taking place on Wednesday February 28th from 6:00 to 8:00pm & SR school.
